Main issue: Federation trainers were not willing to be trained and wanted to be paid but there was no budget	MS staff were trained instead		
MoUs have not yet been signed and this is required for the businesses to start paying the federation	Decision needed on this where federations need to enter into MoUs.		
Currently close to 30 businesses identified with 11 new businesses already begun. However, several are expected to start this month. Expected turnaround (3 months) was too optimistic and finally it took 6 months to deliver the businesses. Therefore EOP data collection on businesses can only start now.	Data collection on businesses to start and complete next week on 11 new businesses.
